# ABOUT THIS TRIP

Borders. If you're anything like us, you find these almost arbitrary lines that divide civilizations to be utterly fascinating and – perhaps – even a tiny bit thrilling. And if understanding different cultures means more to you than, say, booking into a fancy hotel in Sanya, then this action-packed, expert-led weekender may be just your cup of soju.

We're confident in saying that there is no more enigmatic frontier on earth than that which surrounds the DPRK (that's the Democratic People's Republic of Korea officially, or North Korea as most of us know it). The famously hard-to-visit nation is home to around 25 million people, and has a border with China – its only real diplomatic friend – that spans well over 1,000kms, providing those of us that live here with a unique window on to a world that could not be more different.

More than just a peek behind the curtain, this deep dive into North Korea past and present will be led by frequent DPRK visitor and lively raconteur Simon Cockerell, General Manager of Koryo Tours. Over the years, Koryo's team has earned a reputation as the go-to experts on North Korea, hosting visitors like Michael Palin, and arranging countless cross border cultural exchanges from sport and film, music to architecture. Believe us when we say there is no better expert on hand in China for understanding of the country in a way few get to.

Across two action packed days, we'll get the chance to rummage for one-of-a-kind DPRK curios at Dandong's antiques market, learn the Chinese point of view on the Korean war from the museum here, and get a glimpse of North Korean villages from the river. We'll even get the rare chance to visit a Russian graveyard in the countryside of Hekou before heading back.

In short, we may not be able to take you to Pyongyang (yet), but whilst borders are closed there is no better chance to get up close and personal with one of the world's most curious countries than this.

# ITINERARY OVERVIEW

### DAY 1: Friday


After a 5 hour high-speed train journey from Beijing, we'll arrive in Dandong around 6pm and make our way to the Friend Plaza hotel to check in. After freshening up we'll gather to enjoy a lively dinner at a North Korean restaurant with our expert for an introduction to our weekend.


## DAY 2: Saturday

After breakfast we'll set off along the coast of the Yalu River to the Hekou countryside – with a quick stop along the way to visit a hidden gem: a cemetery for Russian soldiers – before boarding a private boat for a rare look at North Korean villages across the riverbank. Then we'll walk on the bridge the Chinese People's Volunteer Army used to cross into North Korea in 1950 and enjoy a riverside lunch before heading back downtown for a brief visit to the Korean War Museum. If time permits, we'll also take a look at Dandong's infamous 'Bridge to Nowhere'.

## DAY 3: Sunday

This morning we'll make a beeline for Dandong's curio market in search of unique DPRK souvenirs. Next, we'll get as close to North Korea as anyone has since January 2020 via a walk on the Broken Bridge and another boat ride across the river for a closer look at the other side, before heading to the airport for our flights home.









## Friday October 15

All aboard! Our group will assemble at Beijing's Chaoyang Railway Station for the G3691 to Dandong leaving at 1.05pm and arriving at 6.04pm.

Once we arrive, we'll be whisked straight to dinner at a North Korean run restaurant in the center of town for an introductory talk from our expert, Simon Cockerell, before heading to Moon Island to check into the Friend Plaza Hotel in Dandong.



#### Morning

This morning we'll set off at 8.30am by road and head along the coast of the Yalu River, the boundary of two different worlds. Our destination is Hekou, but before we get there, we'll make a short stop at a cemetery for Russian servicemen from the early 1900s. This hidden gem is a place few know about and which we'll have special access to.

Then it's another one-hour drive to Hekou proper, where we'll find a broken bridge that was the site of the advance of the Chinese People's Volunteer Army into North Korea in 1950. Did you know that Mao Zedong's son Mao Anying crossed here in November of that year and never returned? He remains buried in the DPRK. We'll board a private boat for a chance to explore the beautiful river and get some rare and unique views of the terrain on the other side, then return for a hearty countryside lunch beside the water.

#### Afternoon

This afternoon the group will head to the 'Museum of the War to Resist US Aggression and Aid Korea' – more prosaically known as the Korean War Museum. It's the Chinese version of events on display in this huge and impressive facility, and a new understanding and approach to the conflict is something guaranteed. Next, we'll drive to the New District of Dandong, one of China's modern semi-ghost towns and the site of the infamous 'Bridge to Nowhere' – a huge suspension bridge leading to a pile of dirt on the DPRK side – a manifestation of previous free-trade-zone plans and intentions yet to be realized.

#### Evening

After a short rest at the hotel, we'll head to dinner for a slap-up meal before heading back to the hotel. Or, for those with a little energy left, a walk through the nearby night market.



#### Morning

This morning after check out, Simon will lead the group to the Dandong Curio market.

Located in an former multi-story car park, this market has a good few gems hidden amongst its rows of stalls. With its proximity to the DPRK, there are often North Korean curios here you won't find anywhere else.

Next we'll walk 15 minutes on foot to Dandong's most iconic landmark – the Broken Bridge, a Japanese structure bombed into the river by the US Air Force that stretches halfway out into the Yalu River and to North Korea. It's the ideal spot from which to view the DPRK on the other side and wonder what is going on over there. We'll then take a short boat trip out onto this stretch of water to get an even closer look, and learn how the border actually works (especially given that there's no boundary down the middle as you may expect).

#### Afternoon

Finally, we'll enjoy lunch in a large private room at Xin An Dong Ge (a North Korean run restaurant serving tasty Chinese classics), where you'll get the chance to ask Simon any final questions before we head to the airport.

If the region (not province) we are traveling to is deemed medium or high risk by the Chinese government, and we are subsequently no longer able to visit the sights/hotels included in the itinerary, the trip will be cancelled and the Covid-19 Sudden Outbreak Cancellation Policy will also apply. However, in the event that the region we are traveling to is deemed low risk by the authorities, and the destination hotels included in the itinerary are still accepting both foreign and Chinése guests, the trip will go ahead and the standard Group Tour Cancellation Policy will apply. Please note that if you choose not to travel, not to take a Covid test or are advised not to by your company/organisation less than 28 days before the tour, we will not be able to issue a full refund. The customer must give Bespoke Travel Company Ltd. notice of any cancellation in writing. The following charges are payable by the customer in accordance with the number of days prior to the service date notice is received by Bespoke Travel Company Ltd.
