## ABOUT THIS TRIP

This is a trip for adventurers. For people who don't mind getting up before dawn to watch the sun rise over an ancient fortress semi-submerged by sand dunes. It's for those who savour a slow overnight desert crossing by train and a rocky ride through the mountains to see archaeological wonders. In a sentence, it's for travellers who thought they'd seen China's top cultural and natural sights, but haven't yet reached these unknown gems on the remote periphery of this enormous land.

In the space of five, action packed days, historian William Lindesay – with assistance from filmmaker and photographer James Lindesay – will return to some of his favourite sights in this most remote of regions and bring you along for the ride.

It's a trip that will leave you feeling as though you really did reach China's remote northern frontier, tasting its ancient history and sensing the drama of its storied past. With such a wealth of archaeology, as well as wild wonders like the Euphrates poplar forest and foreboding Gobi Desert, it's also spectacularly photogenic. The itinerary even includes an exclusive tour and wine tasting at Legacy Peak vineyard.

**TRIP LENGTH:** 4 nights, 5 days (Monday, May 2 –Friday, May 6)

**COST:** Early bird until March 15: 14,950 RMB/person; 15,950 RMB/person thereafter (based on shared double or twin rooms\*\*). Single accommodation supplement: 880 RMB/person

**INCLUDED:** Train tickets, hotels, most meals, vehicle transfers, guiding and all entrance tickets

**NOT INCLUDED:** Beverages (e.g. coffees, alcohol), return flight from Yinchuan, insurance.

# SCHEDULE OVERVIEW

*\*\*B, L, D denotes which meals are included in the trip price.*

## **DAY 1: Monday, May 2 (D)**

Catch the afternoon bullet train from Beijing to Baotou then check-in at the Shangri-la as we prepare for the following day's adventure.

## **DAY 2: Tuesday, May 3 (B, L, D)**

Morning drive to the border region for a fabulous hike to see a finely-preserved hilltop section of the very first part of the first Great Wall of China. In the evening, board the sleeper train to Ejina.

## **DAY 3: Wednesday, May 4 (B, L, D)**

After arrival in Ejina, transfer to the hotel to freshen up. After lunch, this afternoon we'll visit a wild wonder: the Euphrates poplar forest in the Gobi, followed by the local Ejina museum. An evening presentation by William after dinner.

## **DAY 4: Thursday, May 5 (B, L)**

Set off before dawn to witness sunrise over the sand-buried ruins of the ancient city of Khara Khoto. This afternoon we drive out into the Gobi to inspect the scattered ruins of several Xixia settlements. Catch the overnight sleeper train from Ejina to Ningxia.

## **DAY 5: Friday, May 6 (B, L)**

After a very early arrival in Ningxia, enjoy breakfast in the capital Yinchuan, then explore the excellent Provincial Museum. We'll enjoy a delicious lamb lunch at Legacy Peak Winery and of course stay for an exclusive tour and tasting. Catch the evening flight back home.





**DAY 1**

### Afternoon

This afternoon meet the group at Beijing North Station in time for our high-speed to departure to Baotou, Inner Mongolia's largest city.

### Evening

Upon arrival in Baotou we'll transfer to the comfortable Shangri-la Hotel in the city center where we'll enjoy a simple dinner before settling in for the evening.

*\*\* If you prefer to make your own way to Baotou from another part of China, you can meet us at the hotel. The price of the train ticket (around 263 CNY) will be deducted from your tour payment. Please let us know upon booking.*





## DAY 2

### Morning

After breakfast we'll set out for the 2-hour drive through back country Inner Mongolia. The roads in this area aren't always easy going, but they do offer glimpses of local life in this remote part of China. We'll make use of a fleet of Land Cruisers for maximum comfort. Here we'll get the chance to hike around 5km across dry and rocky hills to a gem of the tour – a finely-preserved hilltop section of the very first part of the first Great Wall of China, almost 2,300 years old and almost guaranteed to be entirely free of other visitors.

We'll enjoy a simple picnic lunch in this spectacular location, during which William will give a talk outlining the history of this section of Wall, as well as how he 'rediscovered' it whilst exploring the area many years ago.

### Afternoon & Evening

We'll head back to Baotou for the remainder of the afternoon before a relaxed dinner in the city. Our overnight sleeper train departs this evening at 9.30pm and will whisk us west across the Tennger Desert towards Ejina. Time to settle into your bunk with a good book.





### Morning

Our train arrives at 10am in the tiny town of Ejina, an area incorporated into the Mongol empire under Genghis Khan in 1226. On arrival we check into the Ejina Euphrates Poplar Hotel, surprisingly grand and sumptuous for this remote part of China, to relax after our journey.

### Afternoon

This afternoon the adventure proper begins with a 'Ruins of Desert Cathay' safari. In a fleet of Land Cruisers we drive through varied and surprising desert scenery including Gobi plains, salt pans, sand dunes and glades of extraordinary Euphrates Poplar forest towards our scattered destinations – ruins of Buddhist stupas, remains of frontier settlements and canals of an irrigation system that brought water to the people living here during the Western Han, Xixia and Yuan dynasties (from the 2nd century BC to the 14th century AD). We'll also stop at a section of the ancient Euphrates Poplar Forest. Remarkably, some of the trees have been here for 2,000 years – longer than the area's Han Dynasty settlements! Before we depart, we'll take in the small but intriguing Ejina Museum.

### Evening

As we prepare for tomorrow's expedition, we'll enjoy an illustrated presentation from William introducing the history of the abandoned city of Khara Khoto, including its excavation in 1909 by Russian explorer Pytor Kozlov, who unearthed hundreds of relics from the area that would eventually be displayed in the Hermitage Museum in St Petersburg.





**DAY 4**

### Morning

Today we'll set off before dawn to witness sunrise over the sand-buried ruins of the ancient fortress city of Khara Khoto. Built by the Western Xia in the 10th century, the site became a flash point in 1372 when a major battle raged and a siege ensued between the advancing Ming and retreating Mongols. This is a truly magnificent sight, not open to the general public, and a real treat for photographers in particular. There will be plenty of time to explore the site on foot – those that wish can complete a circuit of the fortress walls before we enjoy a homebrewed coffee inside the site, on what would have been one of the main streets running through it.

### Afternoon

There will be time to freshen up and check out at the hotel before William leads the group further out into the Gobi to visit a Han Dynasty watchtower where a trove of hundreds inscribed wooden slips were discovered, the most important archaeological find in this area. These slips explained the signals soldiers should make to warn others about the scale of enemy attacks.

### Evening

In the late afternoon we'll catch a 5pm sleeper train from Ejina station that will whisk us back across the desert toward the neighboring province of Ningxia. We suggest guests bring some snacks on the train for a light dinner this evening (or make use of the old-school dining car!)





## DAY 5

### Morning

Our train pulls into Linhe, close to the border with Ningxia, in the very early hours of the morning (around 4am) and we'll transfer to a team of small vehicles to complete the journey to Yinchuan by road (approx. 4 hours). On arrival in this relaxed city we'll head to one of its central hotels for a hearty breakfast to fuel us for the long day ahead. We'll start with a visit to the Ningxia Provincial Museum. The well-curated exhibits here give us the lowdown on the area's history, including some excellent info on the Xixia as well as the local Helanshan Rock Paintings, most of which are thousands of years old.

### Lunch & Afternoon

This afternoon we'll get the chance to relax and enjoy a roast lamb lunch followed by an exclusive vineyard tour and wine tasting with the team from Legacy Peak. Founded in 1997, Legacy Peak has been at the forefront of China's rise as a wine producer, and is one of the country's most respected wineries having won several Decanter medals for both its Chardonnay and Cabernet Sauvignon. Even better, this vineyard here enjoys a truly unique location amongst Yinchuan's Xixia Tombs, so after lunch we'll stroll through the fields and explore this marvellous historic site far away from other tourists.

### Evening

This evening we'll transfer to Yinchuan airport for your flight home. We recommend taking flight CA1228, 19:00 departure (or later).

What to extend your tour by a couple of days? Ask us about possible private tours for more sightseeing and wine tasting in Ningxia.



# NOTES ON THIS TRIP

## How to Book

To confirm your place, we'll request a 50% deposit, with the final payment due four weeks before the tour begins. Please note that the final itinerary may change before departure, but we will update you with any significant adjustments that take place.

## What's Included

- All guidance and entrance tickets

## What's Not Included

- Return flight from Yinchuan
- Alcoholic, soft drinks, tea and coffee should be paid separately
  - Personal expenses incurred at your hotel

## Trains

- We plan to take second class seats for the short journey from Beijing to Baotou. For the overnight journeys Soft Sleeper – the highest class - tickets will be booked, subject to availability. Cabins are clean and comfortable (but not luxurious) with four beds/guests per cabin. We'll provide general train tips prior to departure.

## Flight

- We ask you book your own flight back to Beijing (or elsewhere) at the end of the tour, based on the flight recommendations given. If you are not familiar with how to do this, then we're happy to offer advice. We recommend guests consider booking refundable tickets, should the tour need to be postponed or cancelled.

## Reminders

- This trip includes several train rides and access to areas normally closed to foreigners. To apply for the necessary travel permits and tickets, passport details must be provided as far in advance as possible.
- Vehicles will be safe and comfortable (and rest assured we will find the best hotels in each area we visit) but it's tough to find anything approaching Bespoke's preferred level of luxury in these regions so please keep this in mind.
  - Please note that minor changes may be made to the itinerary prior to the trip

If the region (not province) we are traveling to is deemed medium or high risk by the Chinese government, and we are subsequently no longer able to visit the sights/hotels included in the itinerary, the trip will be cancelled and the Covid-19 Sudden Outbreak Cancellation Policy will also apply. However, in the event that the region we are traveling to is deemed low risk by the authorities, and the destination hotels included in the itinerary are still accepting both foreign and Chinese guests, the trip will go ahead and the standard Group Tour Cancellation Policy will apply. Please note that if you choose not to travel, not to take a Covid test or are advised not to by your company/organisation less than 28 days before the tour, we will not be able to issue a full refund.
